Monthly City Meeting

APRIL 21, 2014

Mayor Coomer opened the meeting at 7:03 p.m. at Springdale Presbyterian Church. All Commissioners and City officials were present except City Clerk, Kellye Greene, City Attorney, L. Stanley Chauvin, Commissioner Budniak and Commissioner Hunt, who were not present. Guest at the meeting was Bill Gorman, 3411 Hillvale Road.

Minutes of the March 2014 meeting were not available for review due to the City Clerk being ill. These Minutes will be reviewed and voted on at the May, 2014 City Meeting.

The Financial Statements for the month of March, 2014 presented by Treasurer, Chris Russell, were reviewed and discussed. Commissioner Streit made a Motion to approve the Treasurer's Financial Statements pending audit. Commissioner Davis second. All were in favor.

Bills for the month of March, 2014 were presented by Treasurer, Chris Russell. Commissioner Streit made a Motion to approve the Ordinance paying said bills. Commissioner Davis second. All were in favor. All checks were signed at the close of the meeting.

Resident, Bill Gorman, spoke to the Commission about commercial vehicles being improperly parked in the City. Both vehicles are on Hillvale Road. A discussion was had and it was agreed that Mayor Coomer would view the vehicles in questions, take pictures of same, review the City Ordinances and have Attorney Chauvin send letters to the residents in questions if there are violations.

Angela Leet, Candidate for Metro Council, District 7, came to the meeting and spoke about her candidacy and her qualifications for office. She also answered questions posed to her.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Coomer reported that he had received a letter and package from the PVA asking the City to review and confirm the accuracy of the assessments rolls. This will be dealt with at the May meeting. He also reported that he had received a letter from a resident concerning teens hanging around her home and ringing her doorbell at inappropriate times and for no legitimate reason. This resident is an 85 year old widow who live alone. Mayor Coomer advised that he would notify Graymoor-Devondale Police of the problem so they could resolve this issue before matters got worse.

SANITATION

Commissioner Hunt, who was not present, sent a report by email that an Addendum to the current contract the City has with Rumpke extending the present service for an additional year for the same price had been sent to her by Rumpke. The Commission will vote on it at next month's meeting after reviewing the Addendum.

ROADS AND MAINTENANCE

Commissioner Davis reported that he was going to repair additional potholes in the City in the near future.

ANIMAL CONTROL

Commissioner Davis reported that he had two complaints about dogs. One report being dogs being allowed to run loose in the City and another of barking dogs at 3522 Coronado Drive. A discussion was held. A letter will be sent to the home owners in question by either Commissioner Davis or Attorney Chauvin depending on who had sent the previous letters on the same issues.

BEAUTIFICATION

Commissioner Budniak, who was not present, sent a report by email all lights in the City had been repaired and that all the sensors were in working order. His report indicated that significant improvements have been made to the Burn's real estate on Foxglove Lane. His report also indicated that the grass on th Vista island was not growing properly after the repairs were made by the contractor who installed the sewer connections on the new house being constructed on the Hickey property.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Commissioner Streit reported that the Graymoor-Devondale Police patrolled in the City for 71 hours and billed the City for 65 hours. There were 2 citations issued and warnings issued. House watches were also conducted. There was a discussion about advising residents ask for a house watch if they were attending a funeral and an Obituary listing them as a family was placed in the newspaper etc.

INSURANCE

Commissioner Streit reported that the insurance tax receipts for the City were above expectations.

CITY ENGINEER

Engineer Trautwein had no report.

CITY ATTORNEY

Attorney Chauvin was not present and had no report.
