Monthly City Meeting
Monday, October 19, 2015

Mayor Coomer opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m. The following commissioners and officials were present: Mayor Bryan Coomer, Commissioner Pam Ward, Commissioner Dan Streit (arrived at 7:05 p.m.), Commissioner Lisa Crockett, City Clerk Brian Davis, City Attorney Stan Chauvin, and City Engineer Ted Trautwein.

SEPTEMBER 2015 MEETING MINUTES

On a motion by Commissioner Crockett, and seconded by Commissioner Ward, the minutes for the September 2015 meeting were approved as amended by a vote of 3-0.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The financial report for September 2015 was read by Mayor Coomer which was prepared by City Treasurer Chris Russell. Commissioner Ward made a motion to approve the financial report. Commissioner Crockett seconded. The motion passed on a vote of 3-0.

WARRANTS – BILLS FOR PAYMENT

Mayor Coomer presented the warrants for October 2015 (Warrants 10-01 through 10-12). Mayor Coomer added 10-13 to Brian Davis in the amount of \$186.56 for newsletter printing costs. Commissioner Ward made a motion to pay the warrants. Commissioner Crockett seconded. The motion passed by a vote of 3-0.

PUBLIC ITEMS

None at this time.

MAYOR'S REPORT

The Mayor reported that Commissioner Streit ordered two stop signs and two stop sign frames for Sorrento. Two new poles had to be ordered as well. Mayor Coomer reported that in the 4-6 timeframe for the poles to arrive he would like to finalize the location for said signs. The Mayor and City Engineer Trautwein will take a look at the area and determine the best location to accommodate the requests to slow down speeding cars and make the school crosswalk safer.

The Mayor also reported that the Dinah Court street signs which were removed as part of a utility project will be installed at the same time as the Sorrento stop signs.

OLD BUSINESS

Mayor Coomer opened the floor for old business. Sherry Steier, 3314 Brownsboro Vista Drive, addressed the Commission about the neighbor's brick mailbox that sits in the right-of-way in front of her property. She once again requested support from the city for her efforts to get the neighbor to relocate

the mailbox. Mayor Coomer stated the right-of-way does belong to the city, and it is up to the city to determine whether they want to interject in this situation. At the conclusion of the discussion, City Engineer Trautwein agreed to prepare a statement regarding the mailbox's location in front of Mrs. Steier's property.

SANITATION

Commissioner Ward had nothing to report.

ROADS & MAINTENANCE/ANIMALS

Commissioner Crockett had nothing to report.

SAFETY & INSURANCE

Commissioner Streit reported that the two new stop signs had been ordered. There had been 77 hours of patrol this past month, including eight citations and one warning.

CITY ENGINEER

City Engineer Trautwein has prepared proposals for the next phase of city street resurfacing. The proposal was sent to five different contractors. He has also looked at the reported dip in the road in front of 3101 Brownsboro Vista Drive and stated he does not see how it can cause a significant drainage problem for the site.

BEAUTIFICATION

Commissioner Budniak was not in attendance but submitted a report to Mayor Coomer. One of the entrance signs was recently hit by a vehicle. Commissioner Streit will contact police to see if a report was filed. The fall flowers have been installed at all the city entrances.

CITY ATTORNEY

City Attorney Chauvin had nothing to report.

NEW BUSINESS

Commissioner Streit expressed his displeasure with the newsletter and stated he was not able to submit items for it. City Clerk Davis said an email was sent out and if a commissioner did not respond then he improvised. The next deadline for newsletter articles is December 15.

Paul Martin, 3520 Coronado Drive, stated that he would like to repaint for the crosswalk located at the Sorrento/Pompano intersection. He believes the repainting can't wait until after the resurfacing project and is willing to take on the expense himself. Commissioner Ward made a motion to accept his offer to repaint the crosswalk. Commissioner Crockett seconded. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

There being no further business to discuss, Commissioner Crockett made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Ward seconded. All were in favor. The meeting was adjourned at 8:01 p.m.
