Monday, January 25, 2021

MEETING MINUTES

The minutes from the December 21, 2020 meeting were considered for approval. Streit made a motion to approve the minutes as revised. Commissioner Budniak seconded. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

TREASURER'S REPORT

City Treasurer Chris Russell presented the treasurer's report for December 31, 2020. Property taxes continue to come in. Commissioner Streit made a motion to approve the treasurer's report as dictated. Commissioner Westerman seconded. The motion passed by a vote of 5-0.

WARRANTS – BILLS FOR PAYMENT

City Treasurer Russell presented the warrants for January 2021 (Warrant 1-01 through 1-11). Commissioner Streit made a motion to approve the warrants as presented. Commissioner Budniak seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 5-0.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There were no public comments.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Bryan Coomer reported he received several phone calls about a break-in on Dinah Court. He has requested to beef up the police patrols during the day during the week since residents have expressed concerns about break-ins. Chief Grady Throneberry said the report was for a possible break-in, and may not have been an actual attempted break-in. They are still investigating the claim. In terms of prevention, he said a vast majority of home break-ins occur during the day when most people are away from the home at work. Over the years, he believes there has been a relatively low number of break-ins in Barbourmeade, but they are welcome to increase patrols during daylight hours if that is the discretion of the city.

Commissioner Dan Streit stated he does not think the city needs to increase the number of patrol hours, and the city should instead continue to utilize house checks when out of town, which will help create a police presence in the city. Commissioner Tom Budniak believes the situation should continue to be monitored and maybe action be taken at a later date. Chief Throneberry will work to realign the patrol hours and continue to monitor the situation.

SANITATION

Commissioner David Westerman has not received any complaints.

ROADS & MAINTENANCE/ANIMALS

Commissioner Robert Longshore stated the stop sign at Barbour Lane and Barbourmeade was reinstalled, and the stop sign that had fallen at Old Gate and Breeland has been reinstalled.

BEAUTIFICATION

Commissioner Tom Budniak stated the light in the Coronado island is still out but will be repaired once the rain stops.

SAFETY & INSURANCE

Commissioner Dan Streit reported 77 hours of police patrol the last reporting period.

CITY ENGINEER REPORT

City Engineer Ted Trautwein had nothing to report.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Stan Chauvin was not in attendance and did not submit a report.
