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Monthly City Meeting  
Monday, August 16, 2021

Mayor Bryan Coomer began the meeting at 7:01 p.m. via ZOOM, as advertised on the Barbourmeade website. The following commissioners and officials were present: Mayor Bryan Coomer, Robert Longshore, Tom Budniak, David Westerman, City Treasurer Chris Russell, City Attorney Stan Chauvin, and City Clerk Brian Davis.

#### **MEETING MINUTES**

The minutes from the July 19, 2021 meeting were considered for approval. Commissioner Longshore made a motion to approve the minutes as submitted. Commissioner Budniak seconded. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

#### **TREASURER'S REPORT**

City Treasurer Chris Russell presented the treasurer's report for activities through July 31, 2021. Commissioner Budniak made a motion to approve the report as submitted. Commissioner Westerman seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

#### **WARRANTS – BILLS FOR PAYMENT**

City Treasurer Chris Russell presented the warrants for August 2021 (Warrant 8-1 through 8-10). City Treasurer Russell noted the amounts for Graymoor-Devondale Police (8-1) and Rumpke (8-2) reflect the new amounts for the new fiscal year. Commissioner Longshore finally received a bill for snow removal that needs to be paid. Commissioner Longshore added Warrant 8-11 to Compton's Lawn & Landscape for the amount of \$13,144.00 for snow removal services in February 2021. Commissioner Westerman made a motion to approve the warrants as amended. Commissioner Longshore seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

#### **MAYOR'S REPORT**

Mayor Bryan Coomer had some items that will come up in other commissioners' reports.

#### **SANITATION**

Commissioner David Westerman has had some questions about the recycling containers. Commissioner Westerman has been working with Rumpke to establish a date to have the new recycling dumpsters distributed. August 30 and August 31 will be the scheduled dates for swapping them out. The commission will send flyers out to all the city residents to let them know about this process. Commissioner Westerman and City Attorney Stan Chauvin are still working on the final language in the new contract.

#### **ROADS & MAINTENANCE/ANIMALS**

Commissioner Robert Longshore had nothing to report.

**BEAUTIFICATION**

Commissioner Tom Budniak stated the entrance damage was repaired. Commissioner Budniak stated the property with the trailer on Barbour Lane still has not relocated the trailer. City Attorney Chauvin stated the zoning enforcement officer has been in contact with the owner and the owner will be notified the trailer needs to be enclosed or off site.

**SAFETY & INSURANCE**

Commissioner Dan Streit was not present and did not submit a report.

**CITY ATTORNEY REPORT**

City Attorney Stan Chauvin said he has submitted some hold harmless and indemnification language to Rumpke for inclusion in the new contract. The new tax rate and budget ordinances have been posted in the Courier-Journal and the information has been submitted to PVA for the new tax bills.

**OLD BUSINESS**

The commissioners were asked to submit their items for the newsletter immediately so they can be distributed in advance of the August 30 & 31 recycling canisters.

Commissioner Longshore stated he has still been in contact with the person wanting to expand their driveway. This has not yet been approved. Mayor Coomer would like to get the adjoining property owner to buy in before the expansion is approved.

Commissioner Budniak asked about the status of filling the city engineer vacancy. The person Commissioner Longshore asked about the position is not interested.

**NEW BUSINESS**

Commissioner Budniak stated the ethics commissioners need to be updated. The city will include a call for ethics commissioners in the next newsletter.

City Attorney Chauvin informed the commissioners about a complaint we received from a resident who was asking about AT&T doing work in the neighborhood. He has been working to reach out to AT&T to find out the nature of the work.

The next regular meeting will be on Monday, September 20, 2021 at 7:00 p.m.

With no further business to discuss, Commissioner Longshore made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Westerman seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
