Monthly City Meeting
Monday, November 21, 2022

Mayor Bryan Coomer began the meeting at 7:00 p.m. via ZOOM, as advertised on the Barbourmeade website. The following commissioners and officials were present: Mayor Bryan Coomer, Tom Budniak, Rob Longshore, Dan Streit (7:03 pm), David Westerman (7:27 pm), Attorney Stan Chauvin, City Engineer Jon Muscutt, City Treasurer Chris Russell, and City Clerk Brian Davis.

MEETING MINUTES

The minutes from the October 17, 2022 meeting were considered for approval. Motion by Commissioner Longshore to approve the minutes as corrected. Commissioner Budniak seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 3-0.

TREASURER'S REPORT

City Treasurer Chris Russell presented the treasurer's report for October 31, 2022. City Treasurer Russell stated the balance sheet has about \$1.4 million. Property taxes have started coming in, so the report includes the amount collected through the end of October. Mayor Coomer asked City Treasurer Russell how closely the budget is looking in terms of the estimated tax revenue. City Treasurer Russell said the budgeted amount is looking good so far. Commissioner Budniak made a motion to approve the treasurer's report as presented. Second by Commissioner Longshore. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

WARRANTS – BILLS FOR PAYMENT

City Treasurer Chris Russell presented the warrants for November 2022 (Warrant No. 11-01 to 11-10). The warrants include three tax repayments and Warrant 11-06 was to repair the broken sign at Coronado. Commissioner Budniak believes that Warrant 11-05 includes a duplicate from a bill that was paid last month and should be reduced to \$3,180.00 (City Treasurer Russell confirmed the previous \$2,800 bill was paid). Commissioner Budniak made a motion to pay the warrants as corrected. Commissioner Longshore seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

PUBLIC COMMENT

None.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Bryan Coomer addressed the post office's inability to accept some of the tax bills even though they were sent to the correct address. He appreciates everyone's efforts to help find a way to get people's bills to the city.

ROADS & MAINTENANCE/ANIMALS

Commissioner Robert Longshore received a phone call from the company that bought Compton's to discuss the city's salting and plowing needs for this upcoming winter. The new person said they would honor the previous prices.

BEAUTIFICATION

Commissioner Tom Budniak said the sign has been repaired. Holiday decorations are scheduled to be installed within the next week (weather depending).

SAFETY & INSURANCE

Commissioner Dan Streit reviewed the latest Lyndon Police report. He will also be submitting the bonds for the upcoming year that are needed for the mayor and city treasurer.

CITY ENGINEER REPORT

City Engineer Jon Muscutt received some drawings for a home remodel project. He will meet with the applicant and determine if the drawings are in compliance. City Engineer Muscutt presented the plans for the addition at 3309 Brownsboro Vista Drive. The materials will match the existing home. The Commission stated they are in favor of City Engineer Muscutt to approve the plans once they submit the Louisville Metro building permit.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Stan Chauvin has been working on the organization of the website and the ordinances.

Commissioner David Westerman had nothing to report.

OLD BUSINESS

There was no old business.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Coomer introduced Cory Denbo, who has expressed interest in being the new city clerk. Mr. Denbo introduced himself and expressed interest in being the city clerk. He has been a Barbourmeade resident for nearly two years. Mayor Coomer stated the application period is still open but the commission will be making a final decision by the end of the year.
