Monthly City Meeting
Monday, September 19, 2022

Mayor Bryan Coomer began the meeting at 7:00 p.m. via ZOOM, as advertised on the Barbourmeade website. The following commissioners and officials were present: Mayor Bryan Coomer, Rob Longshore, Tom Budniak, David Westerman, City Attorney Stan Chauvin, City Engineer Jon Muscutt, City Treasurer Chris Russell, and City Clerk Brian Davis.

TREASURER'S REPORT

City Treasurer Chris Russell presented the treasurer's report for August 31, 2022. Commissioner Budniak made a motion to approve the treasurer's report as presented. Second by Commissioner Longshore. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

WARRANTS – BILLS FOR PAYMENT

City Treasurer Chris Russell presented the warrants for September 2022 (Warrant No. 09-01 to 09-18). Russell noted the police payment now goes to the City of Lyndon instead of the City of Graymoor-Devondale since Lyndon took over operation of that police department.

Commissioner Coomer made a motion to pay Warrant 09-18 since the city was unable to make that request during the special meetings. Commission Budniak seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

Commissioner Longshore made a motion to pay the warrants as submitted by City Treasurer Russell. Commissioner Budniak seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

PUBLIC COMMENT

None.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Bryan Coomer said the Kentucky League of Cities has been trying to get information from Commissioner Dan Streit but they have not been able to get in touch with him. This will affect the city's insurance. Mayor Coomer stated someone will need to step up to get this information to them as soon as possible.

Mayor Coomer stated there has been a request to further patrol and sign the area around school. Commissioner Longshore stated he will deal with it.

MEETING MINUTES

The minutes from the September 8, 2022 special meeting and the September 12, 2022 special meeting were considered for approval. Motion by Commissioner Budniak to approve the minutes as submitted. Commissioner Longshore seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

SANITATION

Commissioner David Westerman has not received any complaints about missed pick-ups.

ROADS & MAINTENANCE/ANIMALS

Commissioner Robert Longshore said he has been exploring the request to extend the no parking zone around Norton Elementary. There have also been complaints about traffic backing up along Barbour Lane and Brownsboro Road. He would like to conduct additional research to see where any new signs could go, and whether or not this would require a new ordinance to establish new no parking zones on Barbourmeade Road. Mayor Coomer would like to pursue the idea.

BEAUTIFICATION

Commissioner Tom Budniak has found a professional brick mason to work on the repair of the entrance sign on Coronado. The person can make the repair and clean the bricks to help them blend in with the existing bricks on the side. He will attempt to do the work on a weekend when there is less traffic in the area. The brick mason also stated the bricks and mortar are old and paint will hide defects, which could prevent the identification of structural issues.

Commissioner Longshore has been pushing to get them painted, but if it will be more problematic to paint them then he is OK with not painting them.

City Engineer Jon Muscutt said painting them would bring on an ongoing maintenance issue to fix the paint.

SAFETY & INSURANCE

Commissioner Dan Streit was not present and did not submit a report for review.

CITY ENGINEER REPORT

City Engineer Jon Muscutt had nothing new to report other than he is having trouble finding someone to come do the manhole repair work.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Stan Chauvin had nothing to report.

OLD BUSINESS

City Engineer Muscutt said the house at the corner of Morningview and Alpena has pulled the trampoline back out towards the road. City Attorney Chauvin said he will look to see if that is in violation of any ordinances before he sends David Mudd over.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Coomer said Commissioner Streit has the information for the Kentucky League of Cities insurance but has never signed the paperwork. Commissioner Longshore said he is happy to complete the renewal form.

Commissioner Budniak said the city needs to respond to the lady that asked about the neighbor's tree that she believes could potentially fall on her house. City Attorney Chauvin stated he will respond to the email.

City Attorney Chauvin stated he will get the revised ordinance published so it will become official.

City Engineer Muscutt asked if there were any kind of ordinances that prevented people from cutting down trees on their property. Commissioner Budniak said no such ordinance exists.

City Attorney Chauvin addressed the Jefferson League of Cities request for donations from the smaller cities to give to the suburban fire districts. The request was to share some of the federal funds that were dispensed, but the city did not collect the funds so there isn't anything to donate.

The next regular meeting will be on Monday, October 17, 2022 at 7:00 p.m.

With no further business to discuss, Commissioner Longshore made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Budniak seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

The meeting ended at 7:50 p.m.
