Monthly City Meeting
Monday, June 18, 2018

Mayor Coomer opened the meeting at 7:02 p.m. The following commissioners and officials were present: Mayor Bryan Coomer, Commissioner Lisa Crockett, Commissioner Tom Budniak, Dan Streit (arrived at 7:05 p.m.), Commissioner Robert Longshore (7:18 p.m.), Commissioner City Treasurer Chris Russell, City Attorney Stan Chauvin, City Engineer Ted Trautwein, and City Clerk Brian Davis.

MEETING MINUTES

The commission reviewed the minutes from the May 21, 2018 meeting. Commissioner Tom Budniak requested one correction, which was the spelling of last name of one of the citizens that attended the meeting (Blinco). Commissioner Budniak made a motion to approve the minutes as corrected. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Crockett. The motion approved on a vote of 3-0.

TREASURER'S REPORT

City Treasurer Chris Russell reviewed the Treasurer's Report for May 2018. Motion to approve by Commissioner Crockett. Second by Commissioner Budniak. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

WARRANTS – BILLS FOR PAYMENT

City Treasurer Russell presented the warrants for June 2018 (Warrant No. 06-01 to 06-18). City Attorney Stan Chauvin submitted an invoice for David Mudd for enforcement services in the amount of \$900.00 (Warrant No. 06-19). Commissioner Budniak reminded the Commission that the new Kentucky sales tax law will go into effect on July 1 and will cause a six percent raise to many of the services that the city utilizes (landscaping, snow removal, etc.). Commissioner Streit made a motion to approve the warrants as amended. Commissioner Budniak seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Alan Blincoe addressed the Commission regarding the Graymoor-Devondale Police Department and some of his recent interaction with some of their staff. He does not feel the city is getting their money's worth for their services because they are not present enough and he has not received good service from them.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Coomer asked the committee to submit newsletter articles to City Clerk Davis by Monday, June 25.

SANITATION

Commissioner Robert Longshore had a few minor incidents to report regarding missed trash. Commissioner Budniak informed Commissioner Longshore he believes one of the properties fronting Brownsboro Road (8301 Brownsboro Road) that is not in the city has been rolling a trash receptacle to the rear on Pompano so it is being picked up by Rumpke. Commissioner Longshore will look into the situation.

ROADS & MAINTENANCE/ANIMALS

Commissioner Lisa Crockett received a complaint about a barking dog on Hillvale. She has been over a few times and has not heard the animal but will continue to investigate.

She has also made a list of all the signs that have been tagged with graffiti and she will be making site visits with someone from Eagle Sign to identify the signs for replacement.

Mayor Coomer said he has received a call regarding a possible coyote on the loose within the city. He told the person that if additional sightings are made he would look into the cost of possibly catching the animal.

BEAUTIFICATION

Commissioner Budniak stated he has been removing several real estate signs that have been left in the islands.

SAFETY & INSURANCE

Commissioner Streit reported that there has been over \$108,000 in insurance tax collected during this fiscal year. Graymoor-Devondale Police patrolled 75 hours last month.

CITY ENGINEER REPORT

City Engineer Ted Trautwein passed around pictures of the existing signature entrance signs around the city. He has been working with Land Design & Development to design new signs. Renderings of the proposed signage were passed around for viewing. Mayor Coomer asked for opinions on the renderings and if the commissioners were interested in updating or replacing the existing signs. Commissioner Longshore would like to see renderings that are more an updating of what is in place rather than a complete replacement. The commissioners decided to take no action at this time and recommended taking pictures of signs they do like to share at a future meeting.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Stan Chauvin presented second readings of the following ordinances/amendments to ordinances.

Ordinance 3, Number 2018 regarding the placement of temporary storage units and dumpsters on properties within the city.

Ordinance 4, Number 2018, an ordinance related to the registration of rental properties.

An amendment to Ordinance 10, Series 2007 regarding a change in the ownership or raising of chickens, livestock, etc. within city limits.

An amendment to Ordinance 13, Series 2007 regarding enclosed structures as related to the storage of trailers, heavy equipment/vehicles, etc.

An amendment to Ordinance 17, Series 2007 regarding the completion of construction projects within a reasonable time period. City Engineer Trautwein recommended assigning a specific time period. After discussion, it was decided to make this 90 days, with extensions being up to the discretion of the city engineer.

City Attorney Chauvin also conducted a second reading of Ordinance 1, Series 2018 establishing the rate at \$0.209 per \$100.00 of assessed value on properties.

City Attorney Chauvin conducted a second reading of Ordinance 2, Series 2018 the budget for FY 2019.

Commissioner Streit made a motion to approve the the seven ordinances (Ordinance 1, Series 2018; Ordinance 2, Series 2018; Ordinance 3, Series 2018; Ordinance 4, Series 2018; an amendment to Ordinance 10, Series 2007; an amendment to Ordinance 13, Series 2007; and an amendment to Ordinance 17, Series 2007). Commissioner Crockett seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 5-0.

OLD BUSINESS

City Attorney Chauvin reintroduced David Mudd to the commission members, who will be doing enforcement for the city. The Commission decided all correspondence with Mr. Mudd should be through City Attorney Chauvin.

The airstream trailer which the city had received complaints about has been moved again. Commissioner Budniak went by this morning and it was no there.

Commissioner Budniak reported some violations of various city ordinances that need to be addressed. Mr. Mudd will be dispatched to address some of these issues and City Attorney Chauvin will follow up with letters to others.

City Attorney Chauvin reported a letter was sent to the owner of the property on Easton regarding excessive noise.

Commissioner Budniak made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Longshore seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:31 p.m.
