Monthly City Meeting
Monday, June 15, 2020

Mayor Coomer began the meeting at 7:01 p.m. via ZOOM, as advertised on the Barbourmeade website. The following commissioners and officials were present: Mayor Bryan Coomer, Commissioner Tom Budniak, Commissioner Dan Streit, Commissioner David Westerman, City Treasurer Chris Russell, City Attorney Stan Chauvin, and City Clerk Brian Davis.

MEETING MINUTES

The minutes from the May 18, 2020 meeting were considered for approval. Commissioner Streit made a motion to approve the minutes as submitted. Commissioner Longshore seconded. The motion passed by a vote of 5-0.

TREASURER'S REPORT

City Treasurer Chris Russell presented the treasurer's report as of May 31, 2020. Commissioner Longshore made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as submitted. Commissioner Streit seconded. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

WARRANTS – BILLS FOR PAYMENT

City Treasurer Russell presented the warrants for June 2020 (Warrant No. 06-01 through 06-16). Commissioner Budniak made a motion to approve the warrants as presented. Commissioner Longshore seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There were no public comments.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Bryan Coomer reported having received some complaints about the condition of the property at 3417 Hillvale Road. This is a repeat complaint from one year ago. Commissioner Streit stated he will contact MetroCall to report it. He has also received a noise complaint regarding 3610 Breeland Avenue. Stan Chauvin will send Code Enforcement Officer Mudd over to investigate the noise.

SANITATION

Commissioner David Westerman had nothing to report. Commissioner Streit stated Rumpke has been in his area very early recently, so he asked Commissioner Westerman to contact them about their pickup start time.

ROADS & MAINTENANCE/ANIMALS

Commissioner Robert Longshore reported a complaint about the Louisville Water Company repair that was made at the intersection of Brownsboro Vista Drive and Brownsboro Road. The repair is located in the state right-of-way so we have no jurisdiction over it. He also stated he has received a request to do a speed check on Brownsboro Vista Drive near Alpena. He will request this from Graymoor Devondale Police.

BEAUTIFICATION

Commissioner Tom Budniak asked Commissioner Streit if he contacted the police department about increasing patrols along Barbour Lane because of the Wolf Pen Branch Road closing. He also stated there is a tree blocking a stop sign at Sorrento and Old Gate that needs to be trimmed back.

SAFETY & INSURANCE

Commissioner Dan Streit reported that police patrolled 71 hours last month. Patrol hours will be lowered beginning in July to offset the price increase. He believes there has been more patrolling on Barbour Lane.

CITY ENGINEER REPORT

City Engineer Ted Trautwein was not in attendance but said the large garage that was constructed is now wanting to construct a swimming pool. She will submit a building permit.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Stan Chauvin said the debtor letters were mailed. He has not heard from anyone yet. David Mudd investigated the dumpster that had been on a property for too long and it has since been moved.

OLD BUSINESS

There was no old business.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Pro Tempore Longshore began the discussions for FY 2021. The numbers in the proposed document are based on a report from City Treasurer Russell. The projected total revenue is \$365,600 and the projected total expenses is \$365,600. The commission decided to leave the tax rate at 0.209 per \$100 of assessed value with the same early discounts and penalties available as the previous fiscal year.

City Attorney Stan Chauvin conducted a first reading of Ordinance No. 1, Series 2020 regarding the proposed city tax rate of 0.209 per \$100 of assessed value.

City Attorney Stan Chauvin conducted a first reading of Ordinance No. 2, Series 2020 regarding the proposed FY 2021 Budget for the City of Barbourmeade.

Mayor Pro Tempore Longshore announced there will be a special meeting of the city commission on Wednesday, June 17, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. to conduct a second reading of the budget.

With no further business to discuss, Commissioner Striet made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Westerman seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
